The Black Swallowtail (*Papilio polyxenes*) is a species of butterfly. It is also called the American Swallowtail or Parsnip Swallowtail. It is found throughout much of North America. The Black Swallowtail has a wingspan of 6.7 to 10 cm (2.7 to 4 in). The upper side of the male's wings is black. There are two rows of yellow spots along the edges of both wings. There is a small area of blue on the bottom wing between the two rows of yellow spots. On the bottom edge of the bottom wing, there is a red spot. This large butterfly has black wings with yellow markings and a wingspan of 8 to 11 centimeters. The male displays a row of bold yellow spots, while the female's spots are faded shades of yellow and blue. The black swallowtail's colors mimic those of similar species, such as the giant or pipevine swallowtails. To identify *Papilio polyxenes*, the (eastern) black swallowtail, American swallowtail or parsnip swallowtail, is a butterfly found throughout much of North America. It is the state butterfly of Oklahoma and New Jersey. An extremely similar-appearing species, *Papilio joanae*, occurs in the Ozark Mountains region, but it appears to be closely related to *Papilio machaon*, rather than *P. polyxenes*. The species is named after the figure in Greek mythology. Food habits. The larvae of American swallowtails are attracted to the oils of plants such as dill, parsley, celery, caraway and carrots. These plants have a strong scent.
