Defenders of Milton quickly appeared to answer Eliot. C. S. Lewis, in his work *A Preface to Paradise Lost*, and Christopher Ricks in *Milton's Grand Style* both mounted vigorous defenses of Milton's style. Lewis in particular argued that Milton needed this particular style for a "secondary epic," his term for an epic meant to be read rather than the "primary epic," which was presented orally in a formal setting and meant to be heard. Lewis' basic point was that the grand style provided the formality of setting that the secondary epic, by the nature of its compos...

In depicting him, Milton departed from the crude tradition of earlier religious epics and seems to have adopted ideas from the Elizabethan and Jacobean stage. As has been stated by Daiches (1976), most of the villains in the Elizabethan and Jacobean drama have enough human characteristics to save them from becoming mere monsters. Satan is proud, of course. But beneath this pride lies a tormenting sense of despair. This despair overwhelms him until at last only the desire for revenge reigns supreme in his nature. In Milton and Ecology, Ken Hiltner engages with literary, theoretic, and historic approaches to explore the ideological underpinnings of our current environmental crisis.
