The Battle of Gettysburg (July 1 – July 3 1863), fought in the town of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, was the bloodiest[1] battle of the American Civil War is cited as the war's turning point.[2] Union Major General George G. Meade's Army of the Potomac defeated attacks by Confederate General Robert E. Lee's Army of Northern Virginia, ending Lee's invasion of the North. In May 1863, Lee led his Army of Northern Virginia through the Shenandoah Valley, hoping to reach as far as Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, or Philadelphia, to influence Northern politicians to give up their prosecuti

The Battle of Gettysburg began on the morning of July 1st, 1863, continued through July 2nd, and ended on July 3rd, 1863. The Confederate Army withdrew from the field on the evening of July 4th.

1. June 30, 1863: Union cavalry arrives at Gettysburg. July 1, 1863: The battle begins when Union cavalry intercepts Confederate infantry marching toward Gettysburg. Meade had taken command of Army of the Potomac only days before the battle at Gettysburg. After their retreat on the first day, Meade had to choose whether or not to continue the fight. He knew Lee well, having met him in battle on numerous occasions, and decided his best option was to establish a strong defensive position against the aggressive Confederate leader. The Battle of Gettysburg took place in and around Gettysburg town, Pennsylvania, from July 1 to July 3, 1863. This battle is considered the largest during the American Civil war, and the biggest skirmish ever fought in North America. In this battle, the Union army comprised of 85,000 men and was commanded by Major General Meade. Northern Virginia's Confederate army, had about 75,000 men and was under the leadership of Gen. Robert E. Lee. At the end of the battle, the Union suffered approximately 23,055 casualties with 3,155 dying in the battle. Four months later after this battle, President Lincoln used a devotion ceremony for Gettysburg's Soldiers National Cemetery, honoring the fallen Union military.
