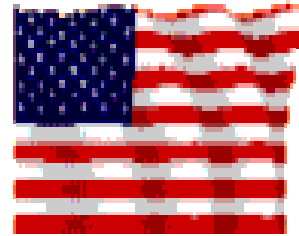

Flag Day in the United States is June 14th

This year June 14th marks the 225th birthday of the U.S. Flag. In 1777, the Continental Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes pattern for the national flag. This would follow almost one year after the Declaration of Independence and more than a decade before the U.S. Constitution was finalized. Flag Day was first celebrated in 1877, the centennial of the U.S. flag's existence. After that many citizens and organizations advocated the adoption of a national day of commemoration for the U.S. Flag. It was not until 1949, that President Harry Truman signed legislation making Flag Day a day of national observance.



The U.S. Flag has thirteen stripes, alternating red and white, each stripe representing one of the 13 original colonies of England. The United States Flag has 50 stars, one for each state of the Union. The last star added was for the State of Hawaii, 1960.

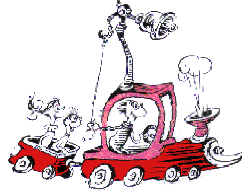

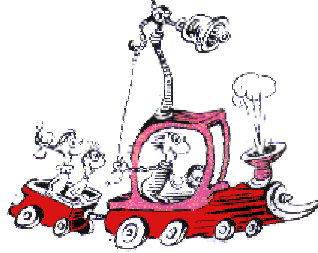
