Israel was eventually reestablished as an independent state by the UN in 14 of May 1948. The British helped the Arab armies that invaded Israel on the first day of Israeli independence in the attempt to destroy it and make another Holocaust, succeeded only to occupy Judea, Samaria (West Bank), East Jerusalem, and Gaza and ethnically cleansed all Jewish population from the occupied area! Between 1948 and 1967, the Jordanian government demolished 58 Jewish synagogues in eastern Jerusalem, destroyed tens of thousands of graves by removing headstones from the Mount of Olives cemetery and using the Israel successfully crippled the Arab world by striking first and effectively crippling their air power while it sat on the ground. In 1944, he moved to Jerusalem, where he worked as a journalist until 1953, covering Palestine and other countries in the Middle East. Since 1955 Laqueur has lived in London. He was founder and editor, with George Mosse, of the Journal of Contemporary History and of Survey from 1956 to 1964. He was also founding editor of The Washington Papers. He was Director of the Institute of Contemporary History and the Wiener Library
